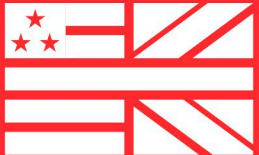

This year's course offering for Fulbright UK Summer Institute participants is: *Scotland's History: Kingdom, Nation, People.*

- St Andrews' School of History ranks in the top 50 university history departments worldwide.
- The course covers four major topics:
 - Origins of Scottish Identity
 - Scotland's medieval connections through stories of alliances, rivalries, and legendary leaders.
 - Renaissance Power & Culture
 - The Scottish Soldier – unpack how war, empire, and media shaped national identity.
- Immerse in Scotland's living culture through weekly explorations of historic sites, artefacts, and landscapes.



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What's included?

- Accommodation provided in University residences.
 - Private bedroom with ensuite bathroom and shower (shared kitchen and living space with other students).
- 17 catered meals per week (Breakfast Mon–Sun, Lunch and dinner Mon–Fri).
- Access to the university's extensive sports facilities

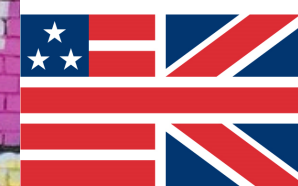

- Build your practical skills in arts, media, campaigning, etc.

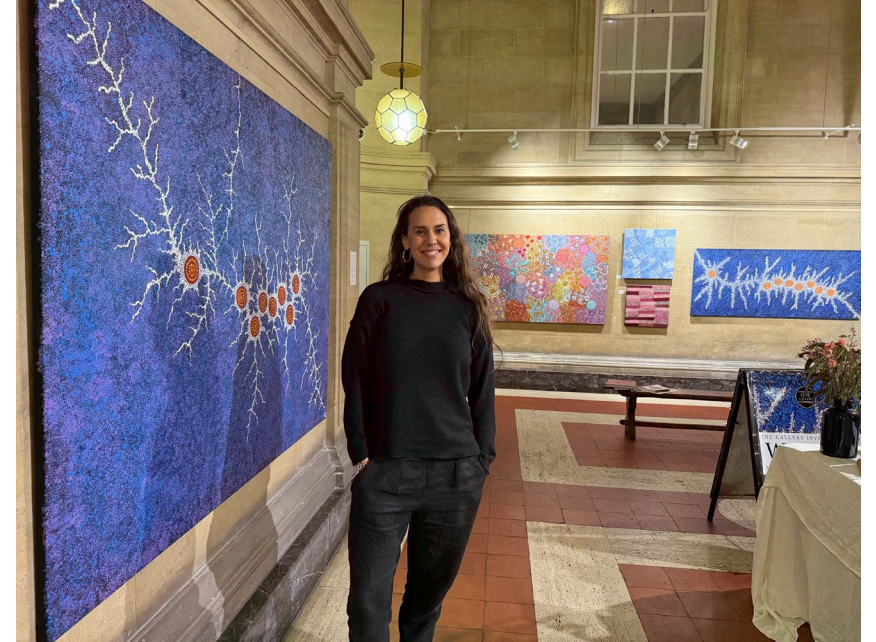

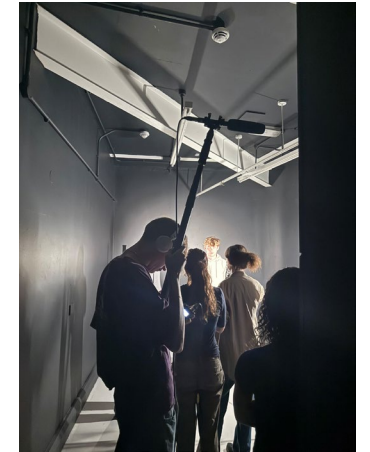

- Classes taught by leading academics at King's

Fulbright Summer Institute 2026

- Britain; Institutions, Power & People and Critical Approaches to Sustainability & Development modules
 - External credit available; 3 credits per module
 - Classes on the Strand Camous
 - 4-weeks of study taught by KCL academics
 - Classes Monday-Friday
 - Accommodation; single room with en-suite shower
 - £30 per diem for meals etc.
 - Travel card to explore London and its environs
- Social programming with the entire undergraduate cohort
